



The Forth 'T'

NOTES on DECRYPTION: With the addition of the 'signature' TT, after 'FORTH', it becomes clear that there are three 'T's in a vertical row and that the mysterious 4th 'T' (The Forth 'T' in the Sonnets' Dedication 6-2-4 decryption) is revealed as the upside down 'T' which spells DE VERE. Following the black and then grey boxes (diagonals with 'WR' down, 'IOTH' up and 'ESLEY' down), Wriothesley's name is spelled out—contiguous with de Vere's. This confirms his centrality to the Sonnets. In his Holy Trinity Solution books Alan Green has decoded a similar formation, which he identifies as a Triple Tau and Inverted Tau Cross, in both the Gravestone and the Monument at Holy Trinity Church, Stratford. The Gravestone's inverted Tau spells the family name possessive, VERES, and the Shakespeare Monument's inverted Tau spells EVERE, i.e., the author's initial and family name, E. Vere.
